After the spectacular entry of Solidarity into great politics, the ‘Polish issue’ became one of the main topics of international discourse devoted to East–West relations. The Polish People’s Republic (PRL) was seen as a potential flashpoint and source of geopolitical unrest, and Solidarity itself fascinated, intrigued, but also aroused fears. The support of Western societies for Solidarity and the opposition of Western public opinion to anti-democratic government tactics, forced the ruling elites to adopt a critical attitude towards the PRL and a friendly attitude towards Solidarity, turning the movement into a decisive factor shaping the relations of Western diplomacy with Polish authorities.





The decade of the 1980s saw events that influenced not only Polish society, but also the country's broadly understood international relations. Undoubtedly, the Federal Republic of Germany was an important political partner for Poland due to the multitude of contacts that were established during the period in question, with both German political parties and trade unions maintaining extensive contact with Warsaw. Taking the lead in this exchange was also the German Federation of Trade Unions (DGB).
